## Finalists Announced for Western Australian ICT Innovation

Western Australia's strong ICT sector is heating up with finalists for the 24th Annual WAITTA INCITE Awards being announced. This premier event is a stepping stone for many finalists who go on to compete against tough international and national competition.

Last year Western Australia showed the world just how strong its ICT sector was with seven WA finalists taking home four wins and three merits at the 2014 National iAwards. These seven finalists later went on to compete at the international Asia Pacific ICT Awards, with one finalist beating out its international competition for a win.

The 24<sup>th</sup> WAITTA INCITE Awards finalist projects covered an extensive range of sectors with products aimed at developing health, education, culture and crime prevention.

Online theft and anti-crime software was a common theme amongst this year's finalists, with products across categories aimed at stopping cyber-attacks on bank accounts, reducing fuel theft, and high-tech forensic computer software.

GoPC.net's BankVault software stops cyber theft from bank accounts. The increase in sophistication and frequency of cyber-attacks is exploding. Two Factor Authentication (2FA) hasn't stopped many business or their banks from being duped. BankVault is a new cyber security device which keeps your banking invisible and out of reach from hackers.

The SImPLE project, developed by Edith Cowan University and WA Police, centres on the development of a highly tailored software application to enable the forensic examination and exportation of selected data from computers. It provides for the rapid, reliable assessment of computer systems in-situ by minimally trained personnel in a forensically sound manner.

Scancam, by Scancam Industries is the world's first cloud based smart anti fuel theft solution. The real-time, easy to use application supports a network of cameras linked to an optical character recognition engine and automates: licence plate monitoring at the bowser, database reference checking, incident reporting and provides a debt recovery solution.

Developed by Ajilon Australian with WA Police, the **MobileHQ** solution enables WA Police officers to perform real time search of people, vehicles and locations using a hand held mobile device. MobileHQ is a HTML 5 application that is device and platform agnostic enabling it to work on any mobile phone or tablet device.
